### COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed as a survey class of the legal environment of business, sources of law, constitutional basis of regulation, social and ethical influences, corporate responsibility, judicial and administrative systems, contracts, torts, agency, business organizations, bankruptcy and consumer protection.

The purpose is to introduce students to the traditional topics covered in Business Law. The course assists the student in applying the basic principles of Business Law to their individual lives and to their careers.

In addition to studying specific legal subjects, this class will examine the history, ethical dilemmas, public policy issues, questions of social responsibility and diversity, and the economics of the legal environment. They will develop a legal vocabulary that will help their understanding of the law in the business environment.
